Our Story:

The DERA organization, a grass roots community organization, is looking for compassionate generous donors or venture capitalists seeking funds to finance and prosecute a potential prima facie \$163,200, 000.00 discrimination lawsuit against the City of Douglas, Georgia on behalf of black city residents.

We have been engaged in a long 6-year protracted struggle for political, social and economic justice against the city for its discriminatory monopoly, redlining sales of electricity/energy to its 2,700 black city residents.

DERA is a legitimate community grassroots organization, unknown outside of rural South Georgia and the City of Douglas, Georgia. DERA operates strictly on the basis of volunteer work, without any funding from any outside sources not by choice but by necessity!
